**1** A Learning Review notification was received by the Adult Protection Committee (APC) in September 2023.

A recommendation was made that a Practitioners Multi-Agency Event occurred to support organisational learning relating to Mr J's circumstances.

- Place of Safety and ASP Screening Decisions
- Assessing capacity
- Multiagency communication
- The role of Housing
- CLDT Knowledge and Understanding of Mental Health Disorders
