We are part of the Justice Social Work Service, working with people who are subject to a Community Payback Order (CPO) which has been imposed by the Court, and includes an Unpaid Work requirement



OUR SERVICES

WE CARRY OUT WORK THAT IS OF BENEFIT TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES ACROSS MORAY

This includes supporting charities and community groups with painting, litter picks, grass cutting, upcycling furniture and more.

We support individuals open to our service to **contribute positively** to their local communities and supervise all work undertaken. We only undertake work which has a **direct benefit to the local community**.

Please note we are unable to undertake work which deprives others of opportunities for paid employment.

We will assess each job request individually and offer an estimated timescale for the work to be undertaken. These timescales cannot always be guaranteed.

We are unable to pay for materials that are required to complete certain tasks ie. wood for building a fence or arrange to take waste to the local recycling sites as there is a charge associated with this.

COMMUNITY FIRST

Scotland's communities have benefitted from around 10 million hours of unpaid work carried out by people serving community sentences since 2011 Source: Justice Social Work Statistics in Scotland Sentences served in the community are more effective than those served in prison. A community-first approach keeps people, who are not yet tried or who pose little or no danger to the safety of fellow citizens, in their communities.
